# **Rector's Message**

December 2021

Dear Parent/ Carer,

I'm delighted to be writing to you in December as we head towards the Christmas holidays and the end of a second school term in our new school. Time flies and it's hard to believe that we are four months into the school session. I'd like to take the chance to thank our young people, families, staff and wider community for your support over the past two terms.

It's easy for us to forget that we have been living through this pandemic for a long time now and I'd like to acknowledge the continuing hard work, support and cooperation from all of our school community that has helped to keep us moving forward safely this session.

Moving from two school buildings into one, effectively merging two schools into one, is a huge undertaking and adjustment for a school community. It has been superb to see our young people from S1-6 thrive in this new environment and have the opportunity to learn together for the first time. We'll continue to identify opportunities to promote this important aspect of school life as we work together to realise our vision of a single site with shared values and a strong ethos.

It is also important for me to recognise the efforts of staff who go above and beyond every day to ensure continuity of learning in what are, at times, challenging conditions. I know that you'll join me in wishing our staff team a very well-deserved Christmas break.

In reviewing SQA performance from last session it is very pleasing to be able to report positively on work done which resulted in such high levels of attainment for young people across S4-6. Almost 74% of all S4 learners achieved 5 or more National 4 passes, with almost 55% achieving 5 or more at National 5 level. In the senior school, almost 60 % of all learners achieved 5 or more awards at Higher Level at point of leaving with over 95% of leavers going on to a positive post-school destination. After a sustained focus on our most at risk young people, it is pleasing to see a 22% uplift on the young people achieving 5 at National 3 level.



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S4 learners have just completed their assessment diet and first experience of sitting assessments in the assembly hall. Assessment performances will be carefully reviewed by teachers to ensure that strengths and areas for development are clearly communicated and shared. Teachers will also be working hard with S5/6 to ensure they are ready for their assessment diet at the end of January 2022. Study Support details have already been shared and are available to view on the school website. Further information on the timing of the S5/6 assessments will come to you prior to the end of this term.

We continue to plan and prepare for the SQA examination diet in April/May 2022. The exam timetable is available to view on the SQA website and can be accessed using the following link. I strongly encourage all S4-6 learners who are following National Qualifications to ensure that their engagement with teachers and coursework remains high and that they consider making full use of resources like study support, which runs at lunchtimes and after school in all subject areas and the range of online resources that are highlighted to them. Taking the time to reflect on progress and address key areas for improvement early, based on feedback from teachers, will make all the difference come April/May 2022.

Throughout the demands of classwork and assessments, all staff are keenly aware that supporting the health & wellbeing of learners throughout the assessment diet is of paramount importance so please do let your child's guidance teacher know if you feel further support is required in this area. Maintaining high levels of school attendance is as important as ever, especially given current events. Over the last couple of years, the average attendance for Madras College has slipped and for the last couple of school session, has been on or below 90% (this equates to more than one day off school every two weeks). It's critical that we work together to address this and ensure that young people are supported to sustain high levels of attendance and good timekeeping for all classes. As one strand of our efforts to improve attendance and reduce absence, I will be writing out to you early next year with a revised draft attendance policy and a summary of attendance/absence for your child as part of our new 'know your number' campaign for improving learner attendance.

Covid-19 mitigations for schools will remain in place following the most recent Scottish Government advice are set to continue in the short term. The school risk-assessment will be updated in line with the most recent guidance from Fife Council's Education and Children's Services directorate. This will remain an active, collaborative document for the foreseeable future and part of our school improvement planning focus. On this, I would like to thank everyone for their support with the mitigations that we have put in place to ensure the safety and wellbeing of all. We'll keep these under review as national and local authority level guidance is updated.

A summary of the current mitigations along with recent updates can be in the letter issued by the school at the end of last week from Carrie Lindsay. Key advice in school remains as follows:

- All young people and staff, except those with exemptions, are required to wear a face covering while in the building. This includes in classrooms and corridor spaces.
- Enhanced handwashing/hygiene measures continue to apply.
- Young people should take the chance to distance/ be outside in the fresh air at intervals and lunchtimes, where possible. In winter months this means that warm clothing and suitable jacket/ footwear will be needed. Inclement weather plans are in place to provide shelter.
- Guidance on school visitors that was issued previously will continue to apply and as a result, events like physical parents' evenings and open evenings will take place virtually.

We encourage young people and staff to continue to use Lateral Flow Testing and to follow current NHS guidance in the event of returning a positive result. Further test kits will be issued to all pupils on Monday 20 December, in preparation for the holiday period and a return to school in January. I'd be grateful if all learners were able to complete a Lateral Flow Test on the evening prior /morning of our return to school. This will help to ensure that we get a strong start to the term.

You will have received a link to a consent form around the use of GLOW/ Teams for two-way 'live' online video lessons between your child and their teacher. I'm issuing this to you as a proactive measure, given the information issued around the need for extended isolation periods for all positive cases of Covid-19 and their household contacts, as highlighted by Scottish Government and in the letter issued by the school from Carrie Lindsay. Consenting to this will mean that your child will be able to take part in a two-way 'live' video Teams lesson, should this be offered as part of a remote learning package. If you'd prefer not to consent to this, be assured that 'live' audio lessons can still take place.

However, I'd like to reassure you that we are very much expecting to be open and conducting business as usual but have been putting plans in place at the same time to ensure that there is a variety of appropriate and relevant tasks and activities available online for learners who may require to isolate. Importantly, learners have been reminded about the process for accessing these resources by class teachers.

Finally, over the holiday periods, our young people will be online for periods of time. Please do ensure that you are aware of what they are doing and who they are in contact with. The last day of term will be Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> December where we will finish at 2.50 pm. We will return on Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> January 2022 and I look forward to seeing our young people and staff return after a well-earned break.

A number of pupils from the Madras College have achieved success in this year's UKMT Senior Mathematical Challenge. Out of the 37 pupils who participated, 2 of the pupils achieved gold awards, 6 silver and 14 bronze.

Both pupils who gained Gold Awards, Reuben Holme (S5) and Andrew Armstrong (S5) qualified for the Senior Kangaroo paper, a very impressive performance.

The Senior Kangaroo challenge took place on Thursday 2 December. We await the results to see how Reuben and Andrew performed. Mathematics continues to be a popular course choice at Madras College with four Higher and two Advanced Higher classes this year.

Participation in national competitions are always encouraged and we will soon receive the first round marks for pupils who are participating in the Scottish Maths Challenge.

We were also joined by Illac Diaz in October from Liter of Light charitable organisation to raise awareness of the climate emergency and saw our group create the electrical circuits for the renewable energy lanterns and wrote of message of hope 'No planet B'. Today we are raising awareness of our group's new focus Litter and Waste, and saying goodbye to 'take, make, dispose', which we aim to tackle in the New Year. 
