# Rector's Message

Dear Parent/Carer,

It's once again December with our Christmas Break approaching and we've been working hard to support all of our pupils in their learning. It's been a busy term with many highlights, including a range of school trips and excursions, for you to look at over the next few pages.

I'd like to begin by mentioning our S4 pupils, many of whom sat their A/B assessments over November and into December as they work towards their first experience of examinations. The marking, feedback to pupils and parents evening has been completed, leaving us all of term 3 for further study and improvement.

Please remember that Study Support will continue to be available to all S4-6 pupils across faculties and has been running throughout terms 1 and 2. Study Support provides an excellent opportunity for further advice and practice so please take some time to talk through what sessions could be suitable. The study support programme is highlighted regularly on the weekly bulletin.

### **School Attendance**

I'd like to start by thanking you for your continued and ongoing support with school attendance. We're in a stronger position again for this session to date, with the overall attendance for our school currently at 90.3% at the time of writing, up from 88.6% last session.

While I'm pleased to see more of our pupils in school for more of the time, we have more to do together to try to reduce absence even further where we can. I've taken the opportunity to recognise and celebrate those pupils who have achieved 100% attendance, and will do this on the last day of term. We'll also recognise those who have been able to improve their attendance in school over the session to date with an event in January – with more details to follow early in the new term.

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# Rector's Message (continued)

### S5/6 Prelims

Our S5/6 assessments are up next and will pupils will complete their Prelim Assessments from 22<sup>nd</sup> January through until 7<sup>th</sup> February. The S5/6 Prelim Timetable will be shared shortly and a separate letter, detailing arrangements for the Prelim diet. Individual assessment arrangements will also follow in January.

#### **SQA Exam Performance**

With regards to our 2023 SQA exam results, I am pleased to let you know that the performance of pupils was again very strong, reflecting the teamwork and commitment from all in school and at home. Some highlights include: S4 Literacy and Numeracy performance at Levels 3-5 continues to improve over time and for the first time, exceeds virtual comparators figures at all levels. This means that have out performed national comparators in both areas – an excellent result!

Our S4 Level 5 results were the strongest set of S4 results so far with over 64% of pupils achieving five or more passes – nearly 3% above our national comparator figure. By the end of S6, almost 43% of pupils had gained five or more passes at Level 6 and our Advanced Higher (Level 7) pass rate continues to be significantly above any national measure, with nearly 65% of S6 achieving at least one pass and over a quarter achieving three or more passes.

These successes and the associated skills and knowledge the come with it help our school leavers to secure a positive post-school destination and I'm pleased to say that almost 96% of all our leavers were in a post-school positive destination at the follow up stage, 6-months after leaving us. This figure is 2.5% stronger than the national picture and builds a good case

I hope that the opportunity to meet face to face has helped you to connect just a little more with our school community.

Following the S5/6 and S1 evenings we carried out a survey to help us with our forward planning. The responses we received were very positive with almost all



respondents feeling that they were welcomed into Madras and that the feedback provided to them helped them to understand how their young person is progressing in their learning. In addition to this most respondents felt the evenings were well organised.

### School standards and expectations

A New Year provides a great opportunity to make a strong start and reflect on standards and expectations across our school.

With that in mind, I'd like to ask for your support with school uniform and helping to ensure that all pupils return to school after the Christmas break 'dressed for work' and clearly identifiable as a Madras College pupil. I fully appreciate the current financial climate and can offer a range of supports with regards school uniform if required – please ask.


# Visit from an Oscar winner!

# Oscar winner brings a slice of Hollywood to Madras College

Former pupil Chris Burdon brought glamour and excitment when he returned to the school for the first time in 40 years with the Oscar he won in March. An acclaimed sound engineer, Chris won the Academy Award for Best Sound as part of a team working on "Top Gun: Maverick". The S1 year group and the National 5 Media class were invited to be the audience for an interview with Chris, hosted by S1 Year Head Mr Wishart. During the session, Chris told students about his time at Madras, starting his career with the BBC and, of course, what it was like to be flown first class to Hollywood and to win an Oscar! He also showed exclusive clips explaining how he worked on the winning film. Some staff and pupils were then lucky enough to hold the Oscar - a truly once in a lifetime experience and inspirational moment.



# Channel 4 Comes to Madras



The S2 yeargroup were lucky enough to take part in the 4Schools project run by Channel 4 in November. Starting with a whole year group assembly entitled 'Big Careers on the Small Screen', this interactive session got pupils thinking about all the jobs involved in TV production. This was followed up by workshops in which students were assigned job roles in groups and had to work together to create a new digital series for Channel 4's digital first content arm - Channel 4.0 on Youtube. ### RME and RMPS



So far this year we have had a very positive start across S1, with pupils engaging with our Belief Matters introductory topic. In particular we have had some great class discussions on the guestion of 'Is there a God?' and even conducted

some in class votes on the question of God. It has been fantastic to see pupils begin to explore such big questions with interest and enthusiasm. S1 have now moved on to a unit on Buddhism. S2 have been studying the topic of racism, with some great assessment posters produced at the end of the topic (see picture). They have now moved on to our new developed course on Christianity, which has tied in nicely with the run up to Christmas.

Our **S3** classes are coming to the end of their Ethics topic, where they have covered a wide range of moral issues, including driverless cars, cloning, cannibalism, saviour siblings and organ donation. It has been great to see pupils thinking stimulated as they work out their own viewpoints.

In **S4** we have seen pupils on rotation, where we have been exploring the arguments for and against abortion, taking this one issue as an opportunity to analyse different viewpoints and the principles behind them.

Our **National 5** class have recently sat their AB tests and have begun work on their assignments, taking time to choose their topic question. **High-ers** likewise have begun their

assignments and are working towards their prelim on 6<sup>th</sup> February (Nat 5s will be sitting theirs during class time to be arranged). Our topics this year include Medical Ethics, Origins and Buddhism.


# SSAA Road Race Championship

# Maths Challenge News



The Maths Department are delighted to share news of a very successful start to the academic year for pupils in the Maths challenges that have run so far.

### **UK Mathematics Trust Challenges**

In October we had 39 S5/6 pupils competing in the United Kingdom Mathematics Trust Challenges. The challenges encourage mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems. They are designed to make students think, most are accessible to the majority of young people who participate, yet still challenge those with more experience. Of the pupils competing three achieved gold awards, three silver and 16 bronze. A special mention goes to the three young people who qualified for the Kangaroo papers which are the follow-on round to each of the challenges. The Kangaroo papers are by invite only with a few thousand young people across the United Kingdom being invited at each level. The qualifiers were Stuart Monks (who gained a merit!), Daniel Armstrong and Ash Simmons. Well done to everybody who participated.

### Scottish Mathematical Challenge

The Scottish Mathematical Challenge is a problem -solving competition for individual pupils in Scottish secondary schools and upper primary schools. It has been running since 1976 under the auspices of the Scottish Mathematical Council. The aim is to promote mathematics as a source of interest and pleasurable achievement. Each year there are two rounds of problems for Secondary schools. 21 young people have participated in the first round, with the second round questions now available for completing. Pupils can ask their teacher for the questions or they can be found online at Problems Menu (wpr3.co.uk). Answers need to be submitted to the university by Friday 23rd February, so we are asking they be handed in to their class teacher by Monday 19th February.

# Scottish Enterprising Maths Challenge

Two teams participated in the Scottish Enterprising Maths Challenge. An event where each team comprises of two S3 and two S4 pupils. The two teams travelled to Bell Baxter High School in September to participate in the Fife heat and performed extremely well placing third and fifth in the overall competition. Their performance resulted in one team qualifying for the National final held at Glasgow Science Centre in November. The team, Rodrigo Braunecker-Sicilia (S4), Oisin Buckley-Zapf (S4), Robbie Spence (S3) and Platon Nikolaev (S3) went on to place 18th out of 52 teams from across Scotland. The young people conducted themselves impeccably and were a credit to the school.







**Next Term...** We are hoping for strong participation in the up and coming Maths challenges next session. Young people should look out for chances to participate in the Junior and Intermediate United Kingdom Mathematics Trust Challenges, as well as *Mathématiques sans Frontières. The latter* is an annual international mathematics competition for senior schoolchildren, centrally run by the Académie de Strasbourg since 1989. This interclass competition involves a number of mathematical puzzles where one of the puzzles is posed, and must be answered, in a foreign language. Each class works as a team to tackle the puzzles in the allotted time.
